Target Audience and Purpose

This annual event is designed for orthopaedic surgeons to glean new, up-to-date research data on techniques and clinical management that will impact their clinical practice immediately. It offers valuable time to interact with clinical experts and colleagues to review specific concerns that surgeons may be experiencing. Additionally, given the current political, legislative and regulatory climate and its potentially significant impact on the practice of medicine, this meeting will serve as a forum to update participants on recent local and national developments in these areas.

Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of this educational activity participants should be able to:

- Identify key political, legislative and regulatory issues pertinent to orthopaedic clinical practice and utilize this information to change their practice.
- Evaluate patients with challenging rotator cuff pathology and develop a clinical plan to help these patients, including referral to a specialist.
- Utilize a combination of basic science and clinical outcome studies on shoulder surgery to help with clinical decision-making in managing patients.
- Apply basic science and data from clinical studies to improve clinical management of common foot and ankle problems.
- Improve competence in areas of orthopaedic oncologic issues including pathologic spine issues, certain upper extremity conditions and other areas commonly seen in orthopaedic practice.
- Improve clinical decision making with regards to anterior cruciate ligament graft selection and surgical technique.
- Recognize relatively new sources of hip pathology and treatment recommendations, and improve patient safety by controlling perioperative infection.
- Improve clinical outcomes in cervical spine surgery and joint arthroplasty.
