## Activity Description

This meeting is designed for the dermatologic physician and will address issues of interest and concern to dermatologists today.

## Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of this conference the attendees shall be able to:

- Identify and recognize how to better treat common skin disorders including nevi, psoriasis, urticaria, contact dermatitis, as well as rare blistering skin disorders
- Describe side effects of commonly prescribed dermatological medications including oral corticosteroids and new biologics, and recognize possible legal issues associated with such side effects
- Assess how contact dermatitis can affect a pediatric patient
- Explain how allergy evaluation, testing, and management can help improve patient outcomes in both adult and pediatric atopic dermatitis

## Accreditation
