# 2010 ANNUAL MEETING

## Meeting Description and Objectives

This meeting is designed for practicing and academic obstetric and gynecological physicians, residents and medical students, and will address common conditions and concerns related to women's health care.

At the conclusion of this educational activity participants should be able to:

- Discuss the complications and outcomes of pre-term neonates in NC and factors implicated in improved outcomes.
- Discuss cord blood banking and the implications of public and private banking, and use of cord blood for treatment of various conditions.
- Discuss factors relevant to egg quality in improving chances of conception in the infertile woman.
- Discuss adult risk associated with diabetes in pregnancy.
- Apply sexual counseling and sexual health to daily practice in gynecology.
- Apply quality improvement in obstetrics practice to ensure a safer labor and delivery.
- Evaluate indications for and benefits of 3-D ultrasound in obstetrics and gynecology.
- Discuss conservative management for severe preeclampsia and outcome implications.
- Evaluate the use of bio-identical hormonal treatment in the menopausal woman.
- Apply current principles of cervical cancer screening to practice.
- Interpret current trends in maternal mortality in NC.


A round robin format **tennis** outing has been arranged at the Grandover Resort. The fee is \$25 including beverages; prizes will be awarded.

## DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The North Carolina Obstetrical and Gynecological Society is pleased to recognize its **2010 Distinguished Service Award Recipient** during the banquet on Saturday evening. **W. Allen "Al" Addison, MD, FACOG** is the Walter L. Thomas Professor Emeritus of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Duke University School of Medicine. In a Duke career spanning nearly three decades, Dr. Addison's clinical research focused on pelvic surgery and reconstruction, pelvic infection, and hormone replacement therapy. His surgical series on vaginal vault prolapse was the largest in the U.S. He authored more than 70 journals and chapters and was the recipient of the Duke School of Medicine Annual Award for Excellence in Residency Education.

He was recognized in *Women's Health Magazine* as one of four of America's Top Doctors for Women in Obstetrics and Gynecology for the southern region of the United States. Dr. Abuhamad serves as interim President and on the Board of Governors for the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine, and is a member of the Board for the International Society of Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Society of Maternal-Fetal Medicine.
