# NC Dermatology Association 2009 Summer Meeting

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The North Carolina Dermatology Association is pleased to announce its 2009 Summer Meeting, to be held at the historic Pinehurst Resort and Spa in Pinehurst, North Carolina. This course is designed for the dermatologic physician and will provide clinically relevant overviews and updates regarding the diagnosis and treatment of not only common and emerging dermatologic conditions, but also practice management topics relevant to the modern dermatology practice.

## Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of this conference the attendees shall be able to:

- Discuss skills for more effective and efficient pediatric dermatologic surgery.
- Examine updates to PQRI, coding for consults and e-prescribing.
- Differentiate between a variety of skin infections (viral, fungal, infestational, and marine in origin), their preventions, diagnosis, and treatment.
- Assess the latest development in cosmetic and laser dermatologic procedures.
- Develop proficiency in diagnosing and managing hair loss that commonly affects African-Americans, and alopecia areata.
- Evaluate new drug reactions pertinent to the skin.
- Examine skin disorders affecting male genitalia.

## Accreditation

This activity has been planned and implemented in accordance with the Essential Areas and policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint sponsorship of the North Carolina Medical Society (NCMS) and the North Carolina Dermatology Association.
