2014 NC LAUREATE AWARDEE: LEE R. BERKOWITZ, MD, FACP

The NC, ACP is pleased to honor the 2014 Laureate Award recipient, Lee R. Berkowitz, MD, FACP, at the Governor's Awards Dinner Friday night, February 28. The Laureate Award is designed to honor those who have demonstrated, by their example and conduct, an abiding commitment to excellence in medical care, education, research, and service to their community, their chapter, and ACP.

Dr. Berkowitz is the Eunice Bernhard Distinguished Professor and Associate Chair of Education in the Department of Medicine at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Berkowitz completed the MD degree at the Ohio State University College of Medicine, followed by residency and chief residency in the Department of Medicine at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He did fellowship training in hematology at Washington University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Berkowitz's academic career has centered on his role as residency program director at UNC, a position he continues to hold. He has also served as president of the Association of Program Directors in Internal Medicine and chair of the test writing committee of the American College of Physicians in-training examination. He currently is chair of the Alliance for Academic Medicine's task force on education redesign of graduate medical education.
