TARGET AUDIENCE AND PURPOSE

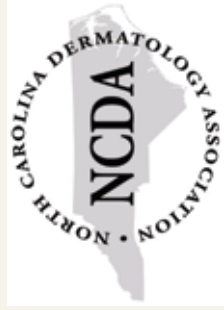
