2014 ANNUAL MEETING

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION AND TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience for this meeting includes ophthalmologists in private practice and in academic medicine, residents, fellows, and students, physician assistants, and nursing staff. This educational activity will update practitioners on the latest medical knowledge available from medical literature, clinical experience and research. This year's meeting will cover many areas of change, and it will also focus on recognizing and managing situations involving increased risk.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this educational activity, participants should be able to:

Achieve faster diagnosis and improved outcomes in patients with retinal artery occlusions.

 Assess results of specialized testing for early detection of Plaquenil toxicity and define how to reduce the risk of this retinopathy developing.

Recognize specific areas of vulnerability within medical practices, and key indicators theft may be occurring.

Employ specific skills and techniques to interact with unhappy patients.

 Recognize features of OCT results that aid in detection of glaucoma, and in determining glaucoma progression.

Assess the potential benefits of Femtosecond Laser Assisted Cataract surgery and prepare for potential

problems that may occur in transition.

- İnitiate treatment plans for infectious keratitis, recognize the signs and symptoms of atypical keratitis, and examine the newest topical therapeutic options available for the treatment of infectious keratitis, and when to use them.
- Recognize Idiopathic Intracranial Hypertension (IIT), manage the evaluation and follow-up of patients with this diagnosis, and select treatment options for this condition.
- Recognize orbital cellulitis in pediatric patients, realize the changing microbial environment especially
 in this era of evolving resistances, and discern how best to analyze the data and treat these patients.
- Recognize various eyelid lesions and identify features that suggest malignancy and the need for surgical treatment.
- Employ self-management techniques to help avoid burn-out and to restore energy, satisfaction, and balance to physicians' personal and professional lives.

CREDIT STATEMENT

The Southern Regional AHEC designates this live activity for a maximum of 9.0 AMA PRA Category 1 $credits^{TM}$. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.
