Subject: Honoring Dr. Darlyne Menscer on her election to Chair of the AMA Council on Medical Education

WHEREAS, Dr. Darlyne Menscer was elected chair of the AMA's Council on Medical Education in June 2015; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer is serving her second term on the AMA Council on Medical Education; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer served as a North Carolina AMA alternate delegate from 1995 to 2008 and then as a regular AMA delegate; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer has served as president of the North Carolina Medical Society (NCMS) in 2006-2007, the NCMS Foundation in 2011-2012, the Mecklenburg County Medical Society in 1996 and the University of North Carolina (UNC) Medical Alumni Association in 1997-1998; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer has been a member of the NCMS Medical Education Committee since 1999, also serving as chair; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer has taught as a clinical associate professor in the department of Family Medicine, UNC-Chapel Hill since 1994; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer is a faculty member at Carolinas Medical Center Family Practice Residency Program, Charlotte, and served as Director of Geriatric Education since 1998; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer, as a North Carolina Institute of Medicine member, has served on the NC Nursing Work Force and Advanced Nurse Practice Task Forces; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer has been a trainer, educating physicians on End-of-Life Care; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer served as a board member of the Bioethics Resource Group for more than half its 20-year existence and as its president in 2001-2002; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer is known as a skilled lecturer, and teaches in a clinical setting, develops and directs courses, authors and edits journal articles, textbooks and newsletters; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Menscer's career reflects her dedication to ensuring quality patient care through thoughtful medical education; and

WHEREAS, many of Dr. Menscer's students, now practicing physicians, consider her a mentor, and still seek her advice and counsel; therefore

RESOLVED, Dr. Darlyne Menscer's experience as a teaching and practicing physician, her leadership abilities and her long-term dedication to medical education make her an exemplary chair to the AMA's Council on Medical Education.
