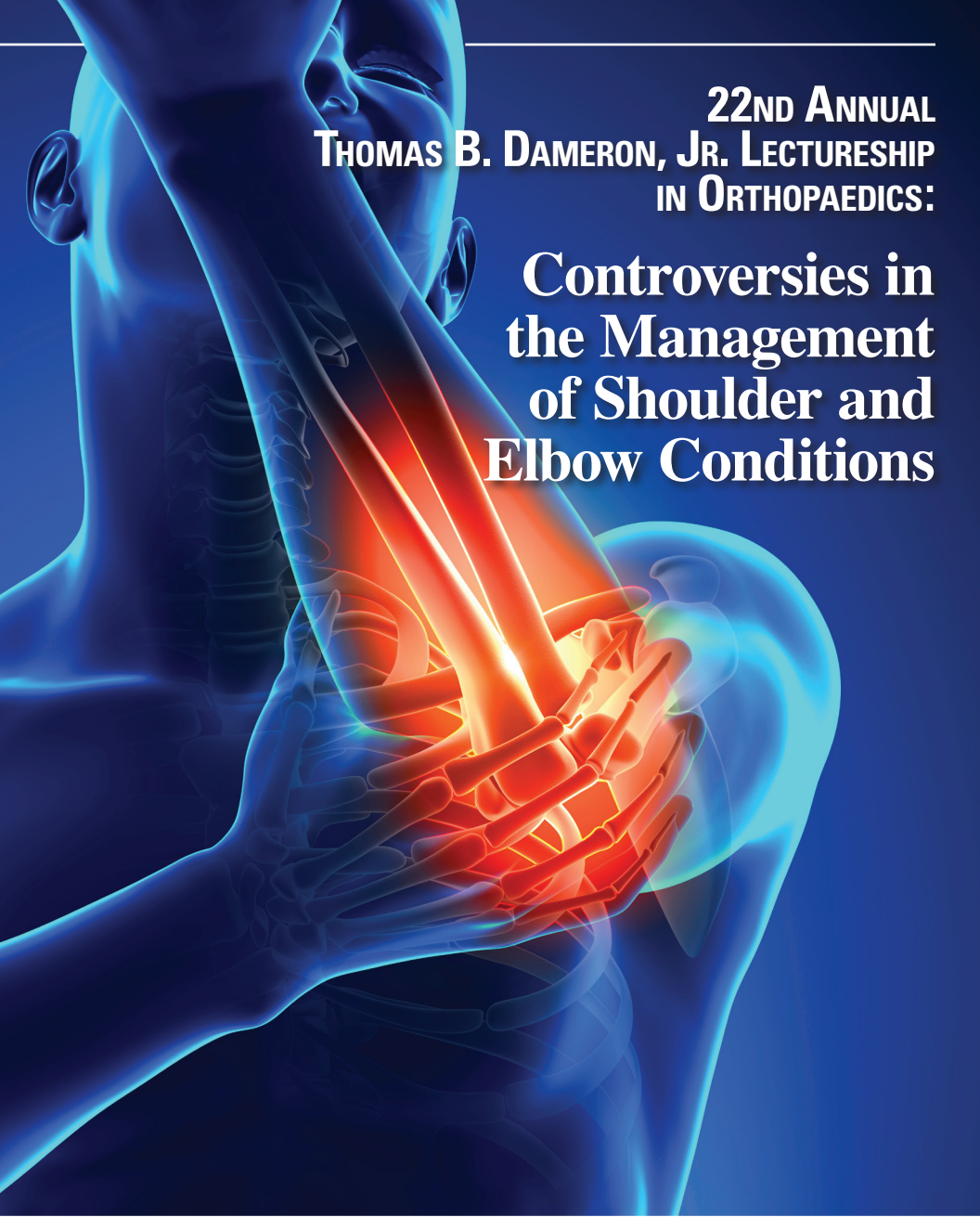

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of the 2015 Dameron lectureship is to first, identify controversial topics in the management of shoulder and elbow conditions and second, to provide current literature and practice-based evidence to help educate members of the medical community on these issues in a “point-counterpoint” format. Experts in shoulder and elbow surgery have been assembled for The Lectureship to discuss the indications for operative and non-operative management and highlight current surgical techniques to address the most common to complex shoulder and elbow injuries.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Physicians (Orthopaedics, Pediatrics, Internal Medicine, Family Practice), Fellows, Residents, Physician Assistants, Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Physical and Occupational Therapists and Athletic Trainers

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Define the indications for non-operative and early surgical management of shoulder dislocations for the in-season contact athlete.
- 2. Discuss natural history of shoulder instability following a shoulder dislocation in the young athlete.
- 3. Highlight surgical management options for glenohumeral osteoarthritis in the young, active patient.
- 4. Debate non-operative versus early surgical management for partial medial collateral ligament (MCL) injuries in the elite, adolescent overhead athlete.
- 5. Illustrate current surgical techniques in the management for displaced proximal humerus fractures in the active, elderly patient.
- 6. Identify research and current trends in biological enhancement of rotator cuff disease.
