

| TARGET AUDIENCE AND PURPOSE |

The target audience for this meeting includes ophthalmologists in private practice and in academic medicine, residents, fellows, and students, physician assistants, and nursing staff. This educational activity will update practitioners on the latest medical knowledge available from medical literature, clinical experience and research. This year's meeting will cover many areas of change, including the role of ophthalmologists in the era of healthcare reform, and Medicare quality reporting, and it will also focus on recognizing and managing situations involving increased risk.

| OBJECTIVES |

At the conclusion of this educational activity participants should be able to:

- · Identify the most common conditions which result in malpractice claims against ophthalmologists and their practices.
- Describe the strategies that minimize error, improve patient safety, and help prevent malpractice claims.
- Review the clinical features, immunological mechanisms, and emerging immunomodulatory modalities of Thyroid Eye Disease (TED).
- · Identify the origins of the terms "cataract" and "glaucoma," and compare historical treatments for these conditions compared to current practice.
- · Identify the psychosocial benefits and privileges that come to health care workers who serve those afflicted with vision loss.
- Assess the potential benefits of Femtosecond Laser Assisted Cataract surgery alone or in combination with "premium" lens implants, including proper patient selection and pre- and postoperative counseling.
- Review the microbiology of Bartonella Henselae, the clinical signs of neuroretinitis that accompany this infection, and review the literature on its treatment.
- · Review the clinical manifestations, diagnostic approach, and treatment strategies for giant cell arteritis.
