

# NC SOCIETY OF PATHOLOGISTS 2011 ANNUAL MEETING

This course is designed to provide a practical overview of selected topics in the field of gastrointestinal pathology, a significant part of the daily practice of most surgical pathologists. Additional topics will address issues of interest and concern in pathology practice, including donations of Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems and the implications of the transition to Palmetto GBA as the new Medicare oversight agency. #### **OBJECTIVES**

At the conclusion of this educational activity, participants should be able to:

- Summarize established and novel concepts concerning Barrett's esophagus.
- Evaluate gastric mucosal biopsies for non-Helicobacter pylori causes of gastritis.
- Identify gastric neoplasia in its various forms and effectively communicate pathologic results and implications to clinicians.
- Present a logical approach towards the diagnosis of serrated intestinal polyps.
- Recognize common and emerging molecular pathology techniques for diagnosis and prognosis in gastrointestinal pathology.
- Discuss the impact of Safe Harbor exemptions governing donations of Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems to medical practices.
- Identify key political, legislative and regulatory issues pertinent to the practice of pathology.
- Recognize the implications of new agency oversight of Medicare Part B services.
